## Gentlemen's Dress Code 6-8

$>$ Student ID's w/all black or VPA lanyards must be worn around their neck at all times. Replacement ID's can be purchased for $\$ 5$.

## Casual: Tuesday, Thursday \& Friday

Khaki straight leg dress pants or shorts shall fit appropriately (No cargo, baggy, or tight fitting pants);
Black colored "Polo" style shirt (short or long sleeves). Shirts shall be worn tucked in if longer than normal fitting. Undershirts may only be white and short sleeved.


## Shoes and Socks:

ALL black casual shoes (ex: Vans, low-top Converse, Sperry, dress shoes, etc.).
No other color allowed on the shoe - only black.
Solid black or white socks.

## Professional: Wednesday

Khaki straight leg dress pants shall fit appropriately (cargo style, baggy or tight fitting pants are not allowed); White Oxford style shirt (short or long sleeves). Shirts shall be worn tucked in. Undershirts may only be white and short sleeved; Solid black necktie fitting snugly around the neck with the length near the pant waistband.


## Shoes and Socks:

ALL black dress shoes. No other color allowed on the shoe - only black. No tennis or athletic style shoes. Solid black or white socks.

Outerwear (coats, jackets, hats, scarves \& gloves):

- Students may wear their choice of outerwear to school;
- No outerwear may be worn inside the building;
- All outerwear must be stored in lockers;
- Boots may be worn to school then stored in lockers; students will need to change into dress code compliant shoes.


## Inside Wear for Cooler Temperatures:

- Sweaters must be cardigan, knit pull-over, or sweater vests only. Must be in good repair (not faded, stained, dingy, torn, etc.) and appropriate length. SOLID black only;
- No sweatshirts, fleece, or flannel.

No hoodies or any attire with hoods; No tattoos; No face or body piercings; No more than two necklaces may be worn at one time; No more than two bracelets may be worn on each wrist; No more than two rings may be worn on each hand; No body art (drawing on skin in any way); No spiked hair longer than 2" or unnatural hair color/cuts/designs; Earrings may be worn on the earlobes; No more than one per ear and must not be oversized. No jewelry, hardware, or temporary materials may be worn on ear piercings; No spikes, jewelry, hardware, or temporary materials may be worn on ear piercings; No canvas belts and/or belts of excess length (only solid black leather belts permitted); No belt buckles with initials or symbols; No medallions/chains worn outside the shirt; No chains that hang outside the pant pocket or from the wallet; No garment that is considered revealing or tight fitting. Colorado law prohibits any gang-related attire.
DRESS CODE VIOLATIONS: If an administrator determines that a student's grooming or clothing violates the dress code, the student shall be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school. If not corrected, the student must have a parent/guardian bring appropriate attire to change into or be sent home.

# Ladies Dress Code 6-8 

$>$ Student ID's w/all black or VPA lanyards must be worn around their neck at all times. Replacement ID's can be purchased for $\$ 5$.

## Casual: Tuesday, Thursday \& Friday

Khaki skirts or dresses shall measure no shorter than two inches above the knee;
Khaki straight leg dress pants or capris shall fit appropriately (cargo style, baggy or tight fitting pants are not allowed);
Black colored "Polo" style shirts. Only the top two buttons may remain unbuttoned. Only plain white undershirts may
be worn. Long sleeved undershirts are not allowed.


## Shoes and Socks:

ALL black casual shoes (2" heel or lower; example: Toms, Vans, low-top Converse, Sperry, flats, etc.)
No other color allowed on the shoe - only black.
No open-toed or backless shoes.
Only white, black or skin colored socks or tights may be worn.

## Wednesday professional dress code:

Khaki skirts or dresses shall measure no shorter than two inches above the knee;
Khaki straight leg dress pants or capris shall fit appropriately (No baggy or tight fitting pants); No denim.
Ladies must wear a white button-up collared dress style shirt, long or short sleeved, with a solid black tie. Shirts shall
be worn tucked in unless straight hemmed. Ladies must wear white undergarments under white dress shirt.


## Shoes and Socks:

ALL black dress shoes (2" heel or lower). No open-toed or backless shoes. No athletic style shoes. White, black or skin colored socks or tights may be worn.

- Students may wear their choice of outerwear to school;
- No outerwear may be worn inside the building;
- All outerwear must be stored in lockers;
- Boots may be worn to school then stored in lockers; students will need to change into dress code compliant shoes.

Inside Wear for Cooler Temperatures:

- Sweaters must be cardigan, knit pull-over, or sweater vests only. Must be in good repair (not faded, stained, dingy, torn, etc.) and appropriate length. SOLID black only.
$>$ No sweatshirts, fleece, or flannel.

Make-up must look natural. No hoodies or any attire with hoods; No tattoos; No face or body piercings; No more than two necklaces may be worn at one time; No more than two bracelets may be worn on each wrist; No more than two rings may be worn on each hand; No body art (drawing on skin in any way); No spiked hair longer than 2" or unnatural hair color/cuts/designs; Earrings may be worn on the earlobes; No more than one per ear and must not be oversized. No jewelry, hardware, or temporary materials may be worn on ear piercings; No spikes, jewelry, hardware, or temporary materials may be worn on ear piercings; No canvas belts and/or belts of excess length (only solid black leather belts permitted); No belt buckles with initials or symbols; No medallions/chains worn outside the shirt; No chains that hang outside the pant pocket or from the wallet; No garment that is considered revealing or tight fitting. Bras are required to be worn by all female students (color may not be visible through clothing). Colorado law prohibits any gang-related attire.
