Girls Dress Code Casual: Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, & Friday

Khaki <u>skorts</u> shall measure no shorter than 3" above the knee; Khaki <u>long skirts</u> only. Khaki <u>pants</u> or <u>capris</u> shall fit appropriately ("skinny", tight fitting, baggy or cargo are not allowed); **Blue** colored <u>"Polo"</u> style <u>shirts</u>. (light blue, royal blue, or navy) *Only the top two buttons may remain unbuttoned*. *Only plain white undershirts may be worn. Long sleeved undershirts are not allowed*.







Shoes and Socks: Casual shoes — any color: 1" heel or lower; *example*: canvas shoes, athletic/tennis shoes, flats No backless shoes. No open-toed shoes. Only white colored socks or tights may be worn under skirts and skorts.

Professional: Wednesday

Navy blue or plaid skort shall measure no shorter than 3" above the knee

Navy blue pants or capris shall fit appropriately ("skinny", tight fitting, baggy or cargo are not allowed) Oxford style white dress shirt: Long or short sleeved; button up shirt with collar

Tie: cross tie or regular tie - solid navy blue or plaid

Shoes and Socks:

Casual shoes — any color: 1" heel or lower; *example*: canvas shoes, athletic/tennis shoes, flats No backless shoes. No open-toed shoes.

Only white colored socks or tights may be worn under skirts and skorts.

Inside wear for cooler weather:

Sweaters worn inside the building <u>must</u> be solid navy blue. Cardigans or sweater vests <u>only</u>. No sweatshirts, fleece, or jackets. No clothing with hoods allowed.

Outerwear: coats, jackets, hats, scarves & gloves

- Students may wear their choice of outerwear to school;
- <u>NO</u> outerwear may be worn inside the building;

CLA school spirit shirts may be worn on Fridays and designated days only. NOTE: Earrings may be worn on the earlobes. No more than one per ear and must not be oversized. Hairstyles (including but not limited to: spiked hair longer than 2", or unnatural hair color/cuts/designs) that draw undue attention to a student are not allowed; Shirts shall be worn tucked in if longer than normal fitting. Medallions/chains shall not be worn outside the shirt; Students may not wear make-up; No more than two bracelets may be worn on each wrist.

If an administrator determines that a student's grooming or clothing violates the dress code, the student shall be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school. <u>If not corrected, the student must have a parent/guardian</u> bring appropriate attire to change into or be sent home.
